GENERAL ADMISSION CRITERIA

Admission Criteria for the DNP Program

General Admission Requirements

- x Official transcripts from apost-secondary institutions of education.
- x A minimum cumulative GPA of a 3.0 in the previously completed nursing master's program professor holding a doctorate from the previously completed master's program.

For Leadership in Population and Community Health Concentration

- x An unencumbered RN license and a Mastebe's ree (MS, MSN, MBA, MHA, MPH or related discipline).
- x Current resume or curriculum vitae indicating employment experience in advanced nursing practice for at least one year.

For Graduates of the UT MSN Program

Licensedursepractitioners who earned their MSN from UT with a minimum GPA of 3.0 are guaranteed admission to the Doctor of Nursing Practice program.

- x Students must have national certification as a nurse practitioner. The personal statement, documentation of MSN clinical hours and one-year clinical practice requirements are waived.
- x Studentswho graduatedfrom the MSNprogramwithin the last five years are exempt from submitting letters of recommendation. Those who graduated more than five years ago must submit one letter of recommendation.
